

From Lori's Desk

Happy New Year!

2020 brought so many challenges and uncertainty. For the first time in my 35+ year career, I had to say the word no. I've spent my life helping other people and then all of a sudden, we had to think how to operate in an environment during a national pandemic. Our office closed for 6 weeks as staff worked from home. We had to stop our medical transportation program for the safety of our volunteers and the clients. Four staff members moved on to other opportunities which just left Karen and I holding down the fort. Meetings were held via Zoom. For the first time in nearly 20 years, the Festival of Trees auction was virtual. I could go on and on.

What did we do? We stepped up to the challenge. We provided care packages to 35 of our AmeriCorps Senior volunteers over the age of 80. We provided 65 germ kits to the Raising Riley children, ages 3-5. We handed out over 2,300 face masks to 21 nonprofit agencies and 562 community members. We provided sanitation kits to our medical transportation volunteers.

With the support of so many businesses and community members, our Festival of Trees virtual auction was a huge success!

How did we do this? We did this because of YOU, our volunteers! We enrolled over 400 new volunteers in 2020, with over 300 alone during the pandemic. Many of you helped to keep our Harvesters, Bloodmobile, and Friendship Meals operating. Many of you stepped up to help the Riley County Health Department with the weekly COVID testing. I'm so proud to live in a community where people will volunteer because they too love their community. Thank you all for being a part of our Flint Hills Volunteer Center!

The annual Veterans Day Parade was a success. So many precautions were in place to make it a safe event. We were extremely proud to witness our two AmeriCorps Senior volunteers, Ray Thompson and Earl Baugher, lead the parade as our Grand Marshals.

Now we move on to 2021. Our office will continue to adhere to the rules set by the City of Manhattan, Riley County Health Department, and the state of Kansas. Masks are required to enter our office. We are still going to do our best to meet the needs of our community. We are all ready for this pandemic to be over, but until then, stay safe and stay healthy!

How are we headed into a new year already- wasn't I just helping with the Father-Daughter Dance last week!? To say it has been a blur of a year doesn't quite sum it up correctly. I started the year in Junction City where I continued to work with the Geary County and Fort Riley community. A few opportunity windows opened at the cusp of the pandemic that led me to a full time role that was intended to be in both Junction City and Manhattan. Just a few months later, the pandemic forced us to close down the Junction City satellite office and we were given the opportunity to give my job yet another revamp!

I have embraced the changes and challenges that COVID has brought to my life and my work. I am one of the lucky few who "doesn't work a day in her life" because I am fortunate to have found my happy place with the Flint Hills Volunteer Center. Here's to a happy and healthy 2021!


